Supports 1 person 3 days with basic emergency supplies. Conveniently packed in a sturdy backpack

Battery Back-up

- YOESOID 20,000mAh Solar Charge Battery Power Bank charges cell phone, ipad, or tablet multiple times

 - 1 Food Bar Packet, enough for 3 days, 3600 calories/day, 5 year shelf life, includes 9 individually wrapped meal size (400 calorie) bars.

Water

12 - Water Pouches, 4 oz., 5 year shelf life

Warmth

- 1 Hand Warmer packet
- 1 Emergency Blanket
- 1 Poncho w/ hood

Medical Kit

1 - 1 Patient Econo Med Kit

Lighting

- 1 Light Stick Green, 12 hour
- 1 5 LED Kaito Crank Flashlight w/ AM-FM Radio

Support

- 1 Whistle with lanyard
- 1 Waterproof Matches (box of 50)
- 1 Multi-Purpose Tool
- 1 Pair Work Gloves
- 2 Dust Mask
- 1 Pair Emergency Reading Glasses

Hygiene Set

- 8 Refreshing Bath Wipes ("reclosable" packets)
- 1 Toothpaste
- 1 Toothbrush
- 1 Comb

Sanitation

- 1 "Toilet-in-a bag" (WAG Bag) liquid-free and odor-free Biodegradable, normal disposal (not hazardous waste).
- 1 Coreless Toilet Paper Roll or 2-Tissue Packs
- 3 Wet naps
- 1 Large 30 gal. Plastic Bag
